Dear Mr. Foster:

This is in response to your letter of July 31, 1987 requesting an advisory opinion on the use of your firm's Cold-Jet Cleaning System for cleaning food contact surfaces.

As described in your letter the composition of the cleaning material is solely pellets of frozen carbon dioxide which under pressure are used to remove contaminants from food contact surfaces.

Based on the conditions of use of carbon dioxide the ingredient will not be used in food, but will sublime into the surrounding atmosphere.

We have no objection to the use of carbon dioxide for the above stated use because carbon dioxide is listed in the food additive regulations as Generally Recognized As Safe (21 CFR 184.1240) for direct use in food.
